COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MAY 23, 2023

Mayor Peluso called the meeting to order at 7:33 p.m.

Municipal Clerk Magarelli reads Statement of Compliance

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting, giving the time, date and information for accessing this public meeting, was advertised in 'The Record' and 'The Herold' newspapers on March 28, 2023, was posted on the bulletin board located on the 1st floor of the Municipal Building, was filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk, and was posted on the Borough's website.

PRESENTATIONS AND PROCLAMATIONS

Mayor Peluso read the Juneteenth Proclamation and presented it to Keshia Austin of the Community Relations Advisory Committee. She announced a Juneteenth Celebration in the Recreation Center on June 19th from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm.

Mayor Peluso read the Pride Month Proclamation and presented it to Tzivya Kraus the Chairperson of the Community Relations Advisory Committee and the Chair of the sub-committee for the Pride Event that will be Sunday, June 11th from 11:00 to 3:00 outside the Borough Hall.

Mayor Peluso read the PTSD Awareness Month Proclamation and presented it to Municipal Clerk Magarelli. Clerk Magarelli spoke about his personal experiences with PTSD and how he was fortunate to have someone to encourage him to seek treatment. He encourages those who are suffering or notice someone who is suffering to seek treatment.

Mayor Peluso read the National Gun Violence Awareness Day and presented to Larisa Mendez Downes, a volunteer for Moms who Demand Action.

Mayor Peluso read the Fair Lawn High School Percussion Team and presented each student a certificate of commendation.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Reinitz

He echoed the Mayor's condolences to the family of former Mayor Bob Landzettel. He had the opportunity to serve with him on the River Road Commission as well as the EDC. He was a very kind gentleman and always had the Borough's interest at heart. He will be missed.

He congratulated the Fair Lawn High School Percussion Team for their accomplishment. He thanked all the people that came to accept proclamations. He spoke about how inclusive Fair Lawn is and how they want everyone to feel welcome. He encourages everyone to come to the Pride Event.

He thanked the Green Team for the Arboretum Festival. He encourages everyone to get involved with the Green Team.

He commended Ryan Graff for all the hard work he is doing for promoting all the businesses in town.

He spoke about gun violence and encourages people to use their voices to prevent the Conceal and Carry law.

Councilmember Rottenstrich

She is looking forward to the Memorial Day Parade that is at 10:30 pm on Pollitt Drive.

She is honored to be sitting on the dais with a hero, Nicholas Magarelli, who is a Veteran and our Municipal Clerk. She thanked him for being so brave as to share his struggles with PTSD with us and for encouraging everyone who may have this condition to seek help. We should never lose sight of the values that we cherish and were hard fought. She feels so proud that Fair Lawn is an inclusive and diverse community that promotes love and not hate.

She thanked Councilmember Reinitz for his comments about Arboretum Day and she agrees that it was a wonderful event.

Deputy Mayor Cutrone

She spoke about how important it is to support our veterans and encourages everyone to purchase a lawn sign for \$25.00 from our Veterans Affairs Council. All of the money goes into the Veterans Affairs Trust Fund to assist Veterans in need.

She congratulated everyone from the Indoor Percussion and she knows, from personal experience, how much hard work goes into the regular band season, but also doing the Indoor Percussion season takes a lot of dedication. She especially thanked the parents who have dedicated so much of their time. She echoed Councilmember Reinitz words on how proud they make the Borough of Fair Lawn.

Deputy Mayor Krause

He echoed the comments of his colleagues on how proud he is of everyone who came out today.

He congratulated our newest Eagle Scout, Ben Levin.

He was at a Chamber meeting and encourages businesses to join.

He spoke about the Memorial Day Remembrance and to honor the veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice.

MAIN STREET MINUTE

Ryan Greff gave the following update of Fair Lawn Main Street, Inc.

- He spoke about the Spotlight program that highlights the various different businesses throughout Fair Lawn.
- During small business week, representatives of the Chamber of Commerce, Main Street, Mayor Peluso and Assemblywoman Swain went to various businesses to share with them different resources that exist.
- The Beatification Committee is meeting tomorrow with the Shade Tree Advisory Committee and the Green Team to discuss greenery projects that can be done on Broadway.
- The Department of States New Jersey Business Action Center have recently hired Jef Buehler to be the manager of the municipal and district revitalization program. He has been made resources available to them at no cost and they are excited to be working with him.
- Historical Committee has been working on becoming a certified local government to free up federal funding for them to use on Historical Preservation projects.
- He and the leadership of the Historical Preservation Committee met with representatives of the Department of Interior, which he met during the Main Street Now Conference, to discuss collaboration opportunities to bolster Fair Lawns historical preservation efforts.

She then asked about Resolution 236-2023 for the Forestry Plan. Councilmember Rottenstrich explained that this plan is to take steps over five years to increase our tree canopy. She then asked about 237-2023 that references the Radburn

Station which is historical. Councilmember Reinitz explained that this was for the Deals Property redevelopment not the Radburn Station. Attorney Verrone stated that this is just an extension of time to allow them to continue to negotiate and finalize a developer's agreement for that property.

There being no more comments from the public, upon motion by Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone a second by Deputy Mayor Krause the time for public comments on Consent Agenda items only was unanimously closed.

BOROUGH MANAGER TRANSITION

Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone explained that they wanted to pursue an interim Borough Manager to give them more time to find someone that they feel is qualified for the position. Councilmember Rottenstrich asked Manager Van Kruijning when the budget season started. Manager Van Kruijning explained that the budgets from each department are due before Labor Day and that he and CFO Palermo start

having meetings with individual departments at that time. Councilmember Rottenstrich stated that they were looking to have an interim manager through the budget season.

There was a unanimous consensus to move forward with looking into an interim manager.

NEW BUSINESS

Councilmember Rottenstrich explained that they can't hold the Farmers Market in the usual place this year and would like to have it at the Arboretum. Manager Van Kruiningen is concerned where the truck would be parked. Councilmember Rottenstrich said that the truck doesn't need to park in the Arboretum, it will just be unload there.

There was a unanimous consensus to allow the Farmer's Market to be held at the Arboretum.

Councilmember Rottenstrich said that the Fire Department asked if they can use the Public Relations Specialist to help promote the Citizens Fire Academy.

There was a unanimous consensus to allow the Fire Department to use the Public Relations Specialist to help promote the Citizens Fire Academy.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Upon motion by Councilmember Reinitz and a second by Deputy Mayor Krause, the time for public comments was opened.

Pamela Coles requested a trucks vs. passenger vehicles traffic study for the former Nabisco site on Route 208. She read some figures of truck traffic from the Daily Truck Trip Generation Comparison of other areas in New Jersey which she believes the new site will double these trips. Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone explained that she would have to go to the Planning Board for that request.

Stella Lamberg requested a traffic study be done for the Fair Lawn Avenue overpass and would like to request a third party perform the study. She extended her condolences to the family of former Mayor Robert Landzettel, who passed away on Monday, May 22nd. She also expressed her concerns for the anti-Semitic comments made by our Planning Board Attorney, Greg Paster.

Mayor Peluso explained that they did have residents bring that to their attention and they brought it to the Borough Attorney. He then explained that the Planning Board is a separate entity and that she would have to go to them about this. Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone stated that not only is the Planning Board separate and if they were to interfere with anything on the Planning Board the developer can sue the Borough because they have interfered. The comments made by the attorney on the Planning Board are unacceptable by her and the rest of the Council.

Craig Miller asked if Coopers Way is borough of property or private property. Manager Van Kruiningen said he would have to look that up on the map. He said that he was asked to leave that property by someone from the Ambulance Corp.

There being no more comments from the public, upon motion by Deputy Mayor Krause and a second by Councilmember Reinitz, the time for public comments was unanimously closed.

EXECUTIVE CLOSED SESSION – RESOLUTION 241-2023
