COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MARCH 21, 2023

Mayor Peluso called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m.

Municipal Clerk reads Statement of Compliance

Mayor Peluso read and presented the Sikh Awareness and Appreciation Month Proclamation

Mayor Peluso read the World Autism Awareness Month and it was accepted by Councilmember Rottenstrich

- They have been informing small businesses of the considerable amount of Main Street America grants available to them
- They have been making the underrepresented groups aware that the backing grants have returned.
- National Historic Trust has a grant for restaurants and historic properties
- Marketing Committee has finalized their marketing plan and narrowed down to three finalists.
- They filmed with Wayne Robbins about their Store Front Improvement Project
- He and Tony DeLisi will be going to Boston Massachusetts for the Main Street Now conference.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Reinitz

Pamela Coles asked what type of goods and services Resolution 154-2023 is referring to. Manager Van Kruijning explained that they are all listed on the resolution by vendor, product and item. She then asked the amount for Resolution 158-2023 Awarding Affordable Housing Agent. Manager Van Kruijning explained that the amount is according to the hourly rate submitted with the RFP. All the fees paid to the consultant comes from the Affordable Housing trust fund, so there is no impact to the budget. She then asked if Resolution 160-2023 is for the geese control. Mayor Peluso explained that there is an issue with geese on 2nd Street and this resolution is to expand the contract with the geese control to this area.

There being no more comments from the public, upon motion by Deputy Mayor Krause a second by Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone, the time for public comments on Consent Agenda items only was unanimously closed.

NEW BUSINESS

Manager Van Kruijning asked for direction on the Local Government Week April 17th through April 21st so that he can make a plan. Mayor Peluso suggested that they do something on that Tuesday in the morning and something in the evening. Manager Van Kruijning stated that he would put out a flyer for Coffee with the Council from 9 am to 10 am, Open House Tours of the Facilities throughout the day and then another Coffee with the Council from 7 pm to 8 pm on Tuesday, April 18th.

Councilmember Rottenstrich asked about the Open Space Grant. Manager Van Kruijning explained that he will be putting on the April 11th Work Session.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Upon motion by Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone and a second by Councilmember Rottenstrich, the time for public comments was opened.

Fair Lawn Business owner Elana questioned Ordinance 2657-2023 and 2658-2023 stating that the fees are too high. She stated that the raise in fees are being done because you are comparing Fair Lawn to Paramus and Ridgewood. The Mayor explained that they do look at other towns but they also consider how it has been since the fees were increased and it is approximately 8 years. She explained that if she tally's up her fees in Fair Lawn, they would be more than Paramus. Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone asked if there are additional fees that you pay that are not in the ordinance. Elana said that there are multiple fees that have to be paid. Councilmember Rottenstrich asked the CFO to provide an estimate of what impact these fee increases would have on the revenues. She would also like to have information on all the different fees before the hearing. Deputy Mayor of Community Affairs Cutrone wanted to investigate if the fees were previously increased without an ordinance. Deputy Mayor Krause stated that nothing has been passed yet and they will have a hearing on these ordinances at the next meeting. He also asked her to do give them all the information on the fees she has to pay so that they are all on the same page.

Pamela Coles asked what the current water rates are and what they will be with Ordinance 2651-2023. Manager Van Kruijning explained that the average user is paying \$5.60 per 1000 gallons, and after the increase, it will be \$6.00 per 1000 gallons. Average user will see approximately \$2.00 a month increase, which hasn't been done since 2014.

Amy Hummerstone gave photos of properties in the Radburn area that were not being taken care of. She said that the Radburn Association does not have the power to fine the property owners. Manager Van Kruijning explained that Property Maintenance is aware of it and it is being monitored. She asked about the Street Sweeper and Manager Van Kruijning said that the Street Sweeper is out every day.
